- "For whoever has (<u>spiritual wisdom because he is receptive to God's word</u>), to him more will be given, and he will be richly and abundantly supplied; but whoever does not have (spiritual wisdom because he has devalued God's word), even what he has will be taken away from him." (Matthew 13:12 AMP)
- Pray that you and I and all the women of Flourish will continue to be receptive to and value God's Word.
- Pray that God will have mercy on our nation so that we can return to Him; for revival and righteousness to come as testimony and witness of His grace.
- I want to make a difference, doing something that makes a difference, with people who make a difference, at a time that makes a difference.
